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PETER MAX

Born in Berlin in 1937 and raised in China and Israel before settling in the U.S., Peter Max made a name for himself in the '60s. "1969 was the best year of my life because three major things happened," Max says. "A man went to the moon, Woodstock and Life Magazine did an eight-page cover story on me." Well, the party still hasn't stopped for the prolific artist who credits his success (and longevity) to his sense of fashion, current events and music. "I can't wait to get to the studio," he says. "At night, you have to kick me out. It's like a playroom for me." There he works on etchings, ceramics, and paintings on canvas and paper. "I just go with one thing — the will to paint," he says. In addition to large museum exhibits, Max presents smaller gallery shows (about 30 a year), and is working on 22 art books and an animated movie set to music. FOR THE SPORTY DAD:

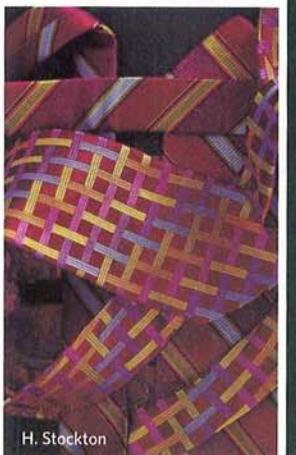

TIP OF THE MONTH

KEY LIME PIE It's summer, which means it's time to bare — your skin that is. And intimate Virginia-Highland spa Key Lime Pie has just what the doctor ordered. During the 75-minute aquatherapy body polish (\$85), spa-goers are sloughed with organic salt from France, rubbed with Caribbean body lotion and massaged with a seven-head vichy shower. It's pure bliss, and leaves the skin soft and supple. The spa actually recommends that you get another treatment following the body polish, because you're too relaxed to do anything else, so follow it up with a full body massage (\$75), a restful hour complete with hot towels, essential oils and just the right amount of pressure.
